

## SIGN MAKING COMMITTEE

### Suggestions:

- try to get paper supplies donated: Tongass Business Center, Judd's Office Supplies, Ketchikan Daily News;
- Recycle bins: cardboard to mount computer printed sign (cut cardboard in advance and have a huge supply on hand – if you make computer printed signs.)
- try to get writing instruments donated: pens, markers, paints\*\*
- try to get sticks donated: True Value paints donating a box of wood paint stirrers
- supplies: scotch tape, staple gun (staples thickness not to puncture stirrers)

\*\*AVOID – paints at the Rally. It will be cold, not a lot of table space to offer for this project and the paints very messy. Have fun with paints during the Sign Making, but not at the rally itself.

Have fun with hand held dry erase boards. Look for donations and hand them out to friends.

BIG PROJECT FOR RALLY DAY – get a roll of paper from the Daily News – it should be white and not brown craft paper – however, it should be strong like craft paper.

There will be a Group Photograph taken of the rally around 11:30 and this HUGE BANNER, with people's message or signature will be held up during the photo shoot.

Suggestion to its title: like a New Year's Resolution:

KETCHIKAN STANDS UNITED IN DEMOCRACY AND HUMAN RIGHTS  
and We Keep Our Promises to every man, woman and child.

If we can protect the banner from getting damaged, we could find someone to preserve it and mount it in the Visitor Center for all the travelers to see and appreciate the effort as an art form.

Find out what people's issues are and pre-print some of the messages on 8x10 paper and mount them to recycle cardboard – in advance. Print at least 25 signs per message? And mount on cardboard (with tape). Due to size of paper, keep message brief. Here are topics of concern:

<p><b>CONSTITUTION</b> We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.</p>	<p><b>GETTYSBURG ADDRESS</b>   <b>Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.</b>   <b>Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.</b>   <b>But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate -- we can not consecrate -- we can not hallow -- this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion -- that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain -- that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom -- and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.</b>   <b>Abraham Lincoln November 19, 1863</b></p>
